
concerts. We are also developing the Mad River Saloon."

Students Learn Abusive Relationships are Wrong

Three hundred seventeen Gibsonburg High School students learned an important lesson; abusive relationships are WRONG! Kathy Newlove of Bowling Green spoke to the students about her daughter's experience from the perspective of a mother. Kathy's daughter, Alicia, and her new boyfriend, were both killed by an ex-boyfriend in 2007. These murders took place while her four children we also in the house. Mrs. Newlove told Alicia's story, about how the abusive relationship began as teens and continued even after Alicia ended their relationship.

Because of this tragedy, Mrs. Newlove founded Alicia's Voice. Alicia's Voice speaks to groups about avoiding or exiting abusive relationships. They also work with local agencies to provide victims with resources to survive the trauma of leaving an abusive relationship. Kathy has worked tirelessly to bridge communications with law enforcement and change laws that will further protect victims of domestic violence.

Signs of an abusive relationship include both physical and emotional events. Possessiveness, jealously, name calling, controlling behaviors as well as physically



hitting and punching are signs of a bad relationship. None of these are signs of love. One in three teens is either in an abusive relationship or knows someone who is being abused by a partner.

The Fremont Chapter of Soroptimist International, through their Teen Relationship Abuse Prevention, or TRAP program, arranged for Kathy Newlove to share her story with the Gibsonburg student body. One goal of the Soroptimists group is to educate young people about healthy relationships in the hopes of someday ending domestic violence.
